Lights and Safe	Consulted in HP TWiG, WASH Sector and other sectors. Final Document on Lights and Safe
access to WASH	access in camps was approved by SAG on 6 February 2023. Lights and Safe Access to WASH
facilities at night	facilities in camps
	 Lights illuminating access only and not to be installed inside wash facilities.
Menstrual Hygiene Management	 WASH Sectors minimum standard for MHM kit was finalised and approved by SAG on 6 February 2023 (<u>here</u>) 6 Laundry soaps, 4m² of cloth or 6 reusable pads and 3 pants (small, medium, and large size)/6months for menstruating women
Waste Management	 <u>SDC Study</u> sharing that outlined household (HH) collection generates better segregated waste compared to communal collection. However, waste collection through HH
Management	 (40kg/volunteer/day) is lesser in quantity compared to communal collection (80 kg/Volunteer/day). Difference in cost is quite similar for HH collection BDT 133 compared to BDT 158 for communal collection. Oxfam study had similar finding too for HH collection. Following technical consultation meeting on 14 March 2023 3 Key messages were agreed-1. No littering anywhere including drains, latrines, around your surroundings, learning centres, market
	 Segregate your organic and inorganic waste in colour coded bins Clean your surrounding and dispose the waste either in designated area or keep it aside for your waste collector volunteer.
Prior assessment before distributing WASH NFI (e.g. Water container)	 There was a discussion on beneficiaries storing water past 24 hours in the HP TWiG, one possible reason for that was assumed to be distribution of excess number of water container. <u>World Vision study</u> proved it where 46% respondents in the camps had more than 5 water containers. Therefore, random distribution of WASH NFI is discouraged without any prior assessment
Recommendations on Bathing Facilities	 Keep your bathing facility hygienic, clean, and dry regardless of location (communal or informal household bathing facilities) Ensure proper drainage from the space. Refrain from using this space for defecation.
