Guidance on free online courses on CVA

The potential of cash and voucher assistance (CVA) cannot be realized by organizations working alone. Since our founding in 2005, **Cash Learning Platform (CaLP)** has been at the forefront of promoting and improving CVA across the humanitarian sector.

CaLP enables collaboration between organizations to increase the scale and quality of CVA, while also supporting them to make their own progress. We do this by bringing organizations together to strengthen capacity, knowledge, coordination, and policy for CVA.

Capacity Building

Through the capacity building activities, CaLP aims to provide the humanitarian community with the skills needed to deliver quality CVA. CaLP provides opportunities for individuals to build knowledge and expertise and works with humanitarian organizations to promote innovation and good practice in CVA. This is delivered via standard training activities, specialized workshops, and self-directed capacity building opportunities.

Process of enrolment

All available online courses are free but requires to ensure individual's registration at humanitarian leadership academy led **Kaya-Connect platform** as all the courses are linked with it. Therefore, interested individual first to registered at KayaConnect and then follow the course mentioned below to have access.

FOUNDATION COURSES

Cash and voucher assistance (CVA) - the fundamentals

This course is designed for anyone who wants to learn more about cash and voucher
