Protection Sector Update	 The protection monitoring report has been updated in collaboration with the subsectors and will be published soon. PS will continue the inter-sectoral monitoring. The Q2 report will also be published soon. On World Day Against Trafficking in Persons (30th July), all agencies working on antitrafficking are suggested to coordinate with ATWG. UNHCR has been elected as the Co-Chair of the Gender Diverse Population Working Group. A discussion was held with (CARU) of UNDP to address increased camp abductions and killings. The FGD for monitoring the impacts of adjustment of assistance packages has been finalized, and the rollout is expected to begin next week. Inputs for the Tip sheet on Protection Mainstreaming for the Livelihood Sector have been provided. The House, Land, and Property Technical Group have been dissolved, and one person/focal point will be recruited under the Protection Sector. GBVSS Update	 The Gender Transformative Approach (GTA) workshop had 35 participants (29 female and 6 male). The aim was to equip them with specific skills and key takeaways to apply gender transformative approaches in designing new programs and implementing current projects. These approaches can then be disseminated to all relevant actors The JRP agencies' service facility mapping tool is being updated for Q2 (April-June 2023) and will be completed by the end of July. The GBVSS contact list has been updated. After the update, there are 60 member agencies in the GBV (where 8 are UN agencies, 20 INGOs, 30 NNGOs, and 2 Red Cross organizations). A GBVIMS TT meeting was held to discuss Q2 data, including a request for partners to submit the top 5/3 camps within their AoR with the highest GBV incidents. The GBVSS cannot retrieve this data through the compiled information from the Data gathering organizations. A meeting took place with the ADWG, CMWG, and GBV Nexus team. The focus of the discussion was the support that ADWG could provide in assisting survivors with disabilities during the case management process. They highlighted that there are less than two persons trained in sign language in Cox's Bazaar, making it difficult to effectively reach the target population. 	- GBVSS will be sending guidance notes for the ADWG training on sign language. - GBVSS will share the procedure for reaching GBVSS out to the pool of trainers, which can be used as a resource for organizational training.		



PSEA Network Update	 PSEA SOP has been developed to explain PSEA, focusing on strengthening reporting comprehensively. A survey for complaint feedback was conducted last month, and the trust level among refugees has increased. The resource hub for PSEA is now available. CPSS participated in the workshop to advocate for basic CP training/orientation for ECD staff. Identified areas where CPSS and ECD network can collaborate, such as resource sharing and training facilitation. Integrated ECD programming begins after piloting, funded by UNICEF.
