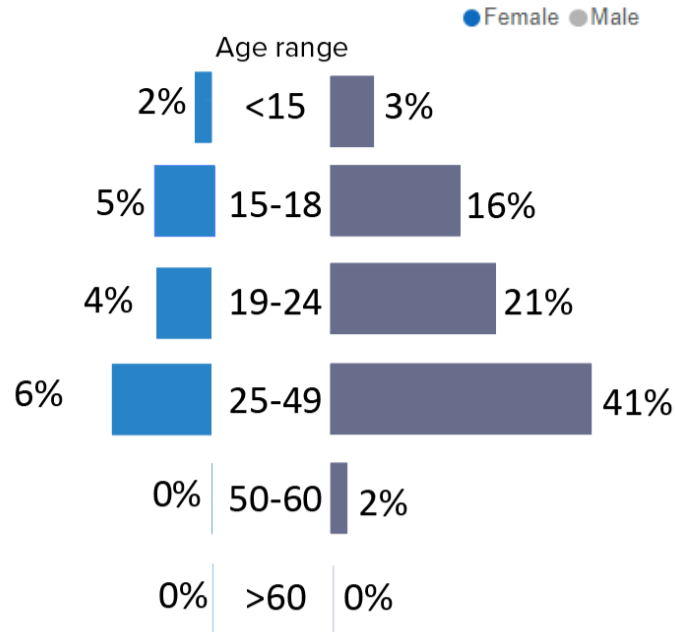

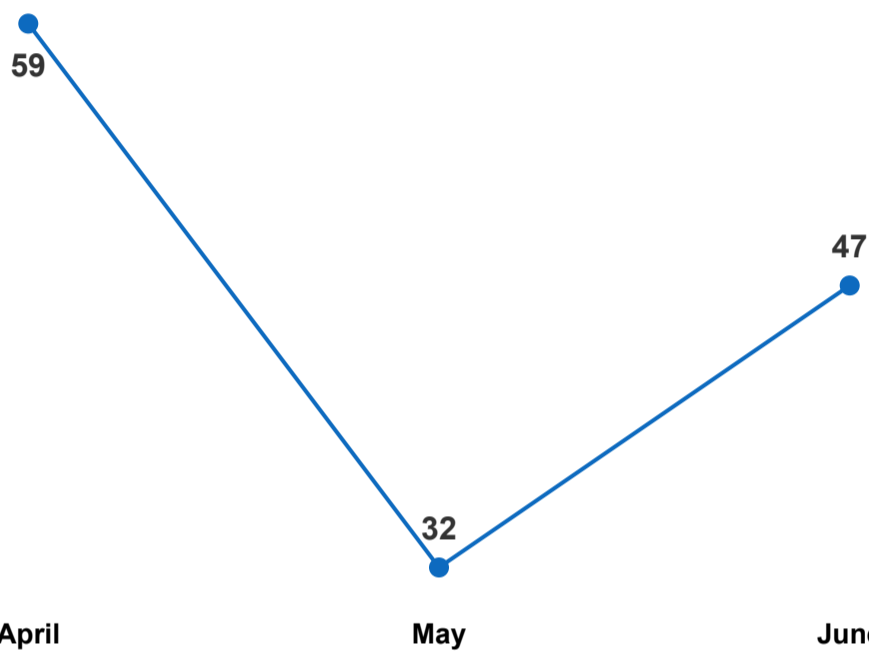

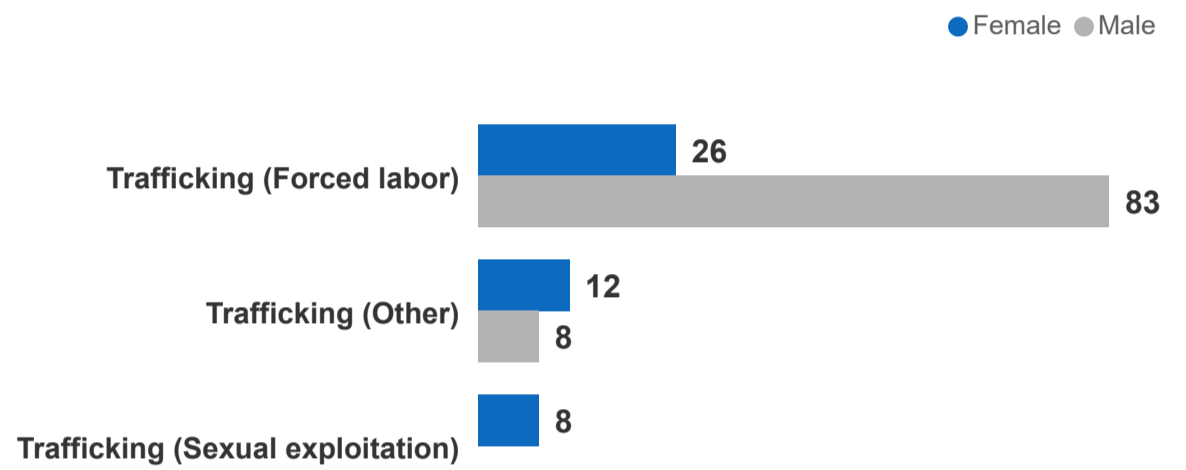
The Dashboard reflects available data about Rohingya refugees' victims of human trafficking that ATWG members have identified, referred, and assisted: 138 refugees identified between April and June 2023. Compared to the second quarter of 2023, the number of trafficking victims identified by the ATWG members has doubled. This increase is not indicative of a rise in human trafficking in the camps; rather, it reflects the intensified efforts in awareness-raising activities and specialized training for victim identification and screening. The data on this Dashboard is generated from information communicated by ATWG members and should not be interpreted as showing the extent of prevalence of human trafficking in the camps. These statistics may be subject to change.

66% of identified victims are male and 34% female

Number of Identified Victims by Month

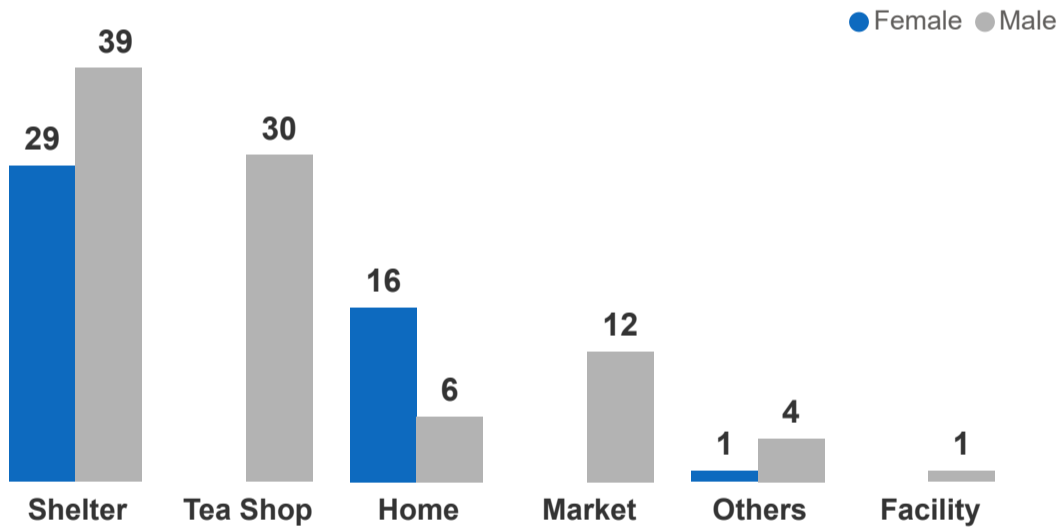


Type of Exploitation



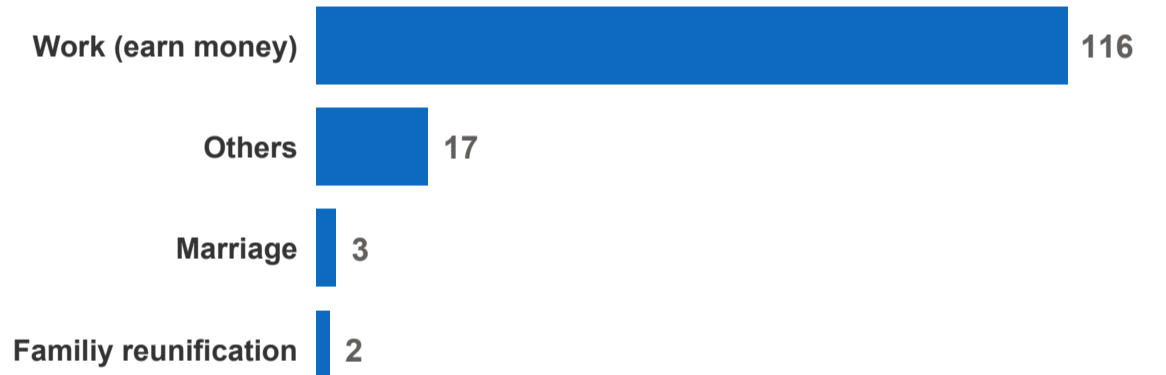
88% of the reported cases were victims of labour trafficking.

Place of Recruitment by Gender



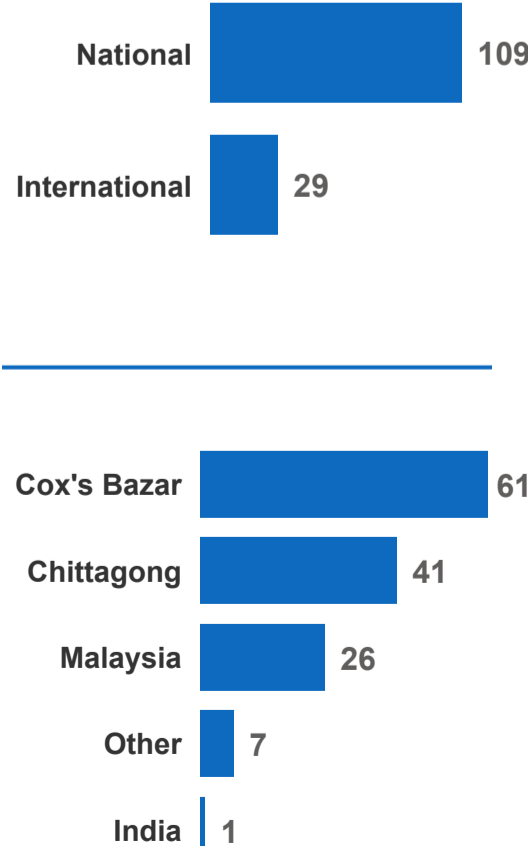
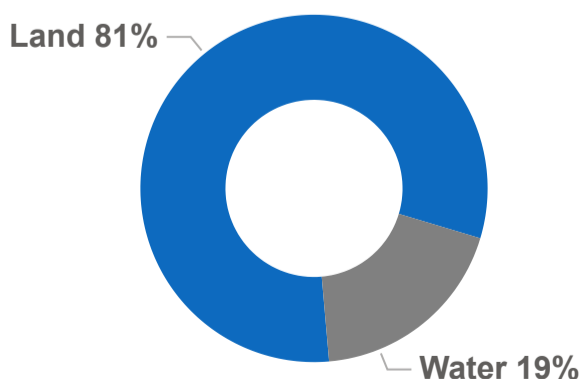
The recruitment or initial engagement into the trafficking situation occurs mostly while refugees are at "home" in their shelters

Promises During Recruitment

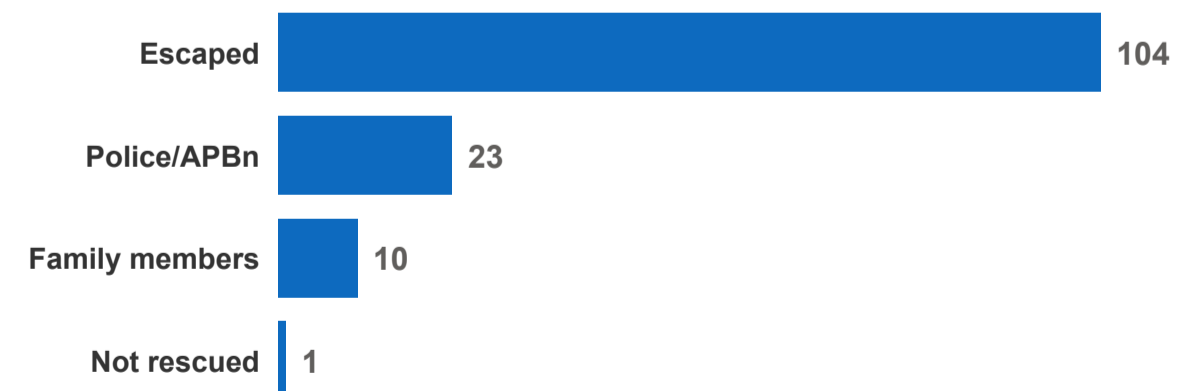


90% of cases reported involved promises of work made at the recruitment stage. In most cases, the activity during exploitation was in agriculture, construction, domestic work, livestock raising, and day labor
