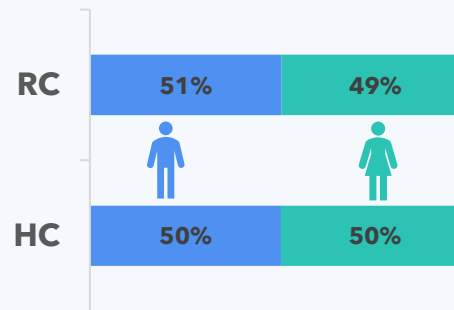

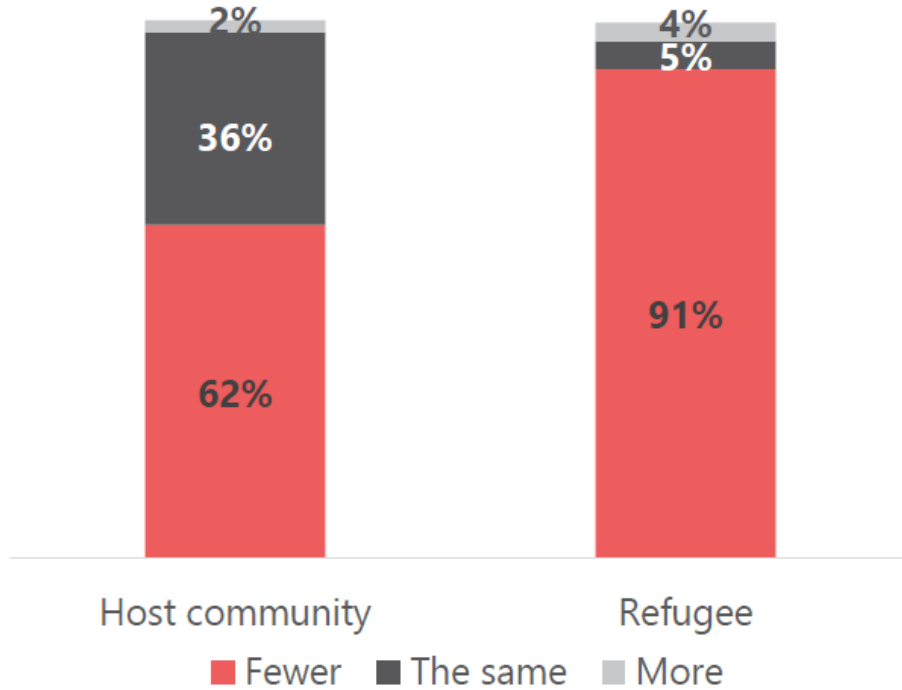

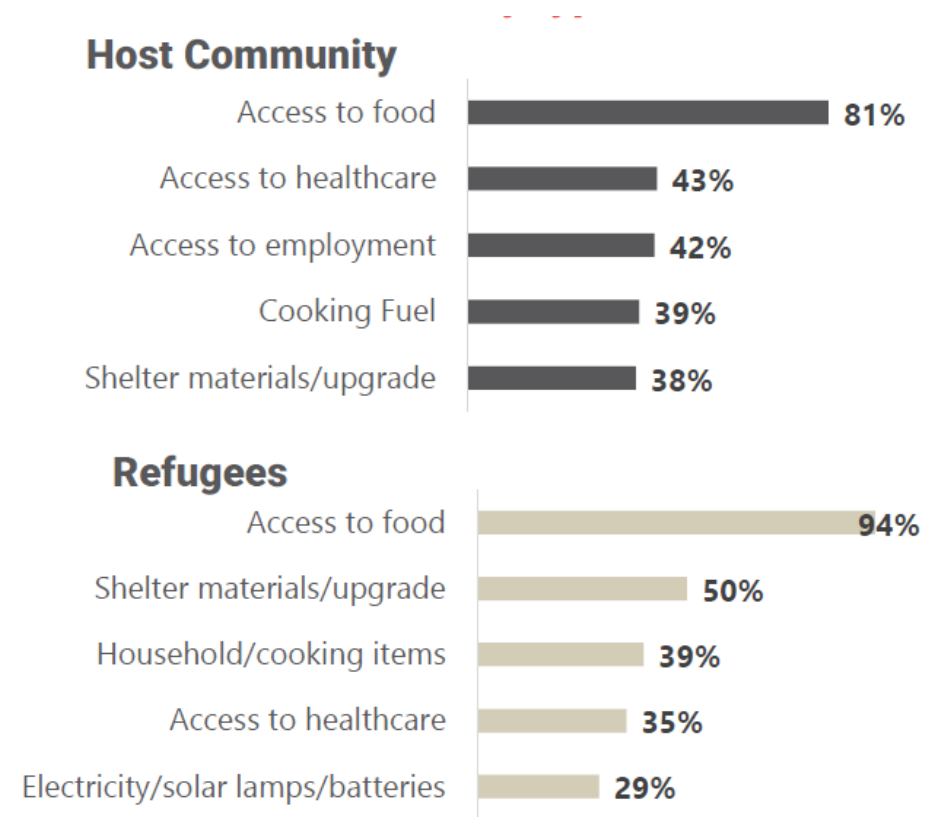

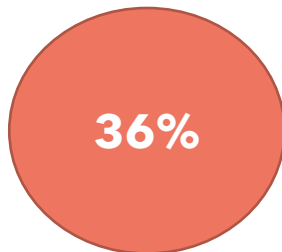
**% of households' reporting changes in their ability to afford goods and services the year prior to data collection**



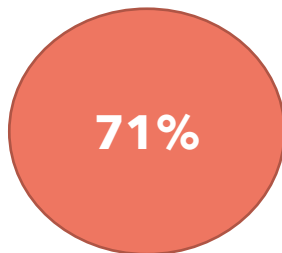
**% of households' reporting being able to afford fewer goods and services the year prior data collection, by type\***

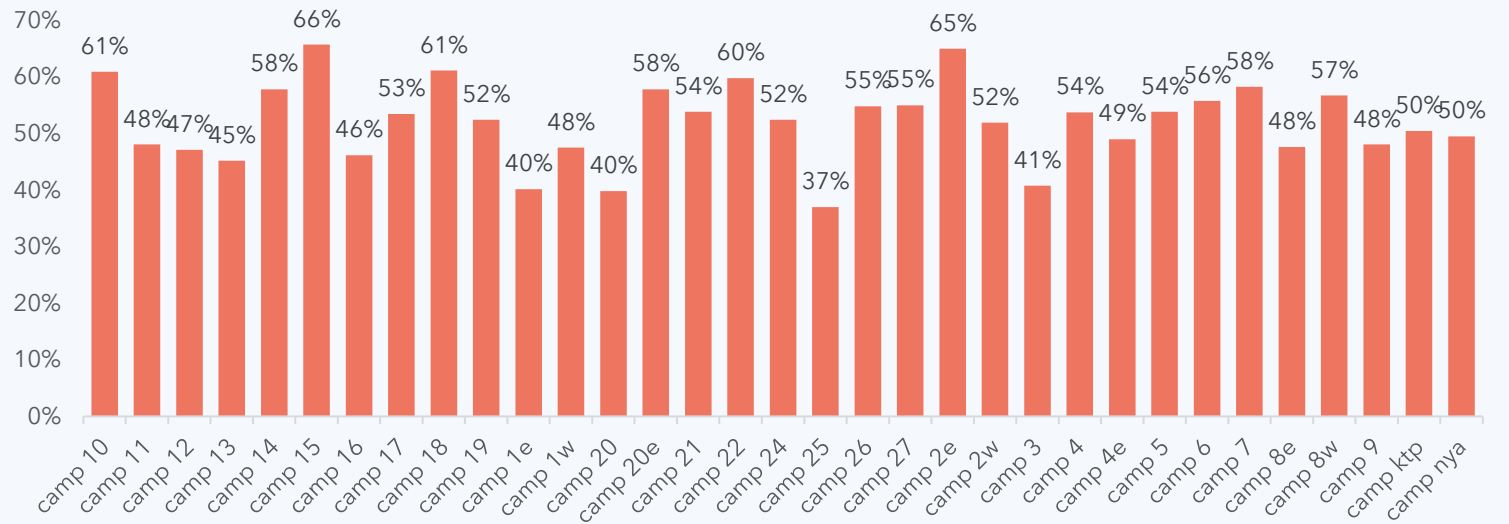
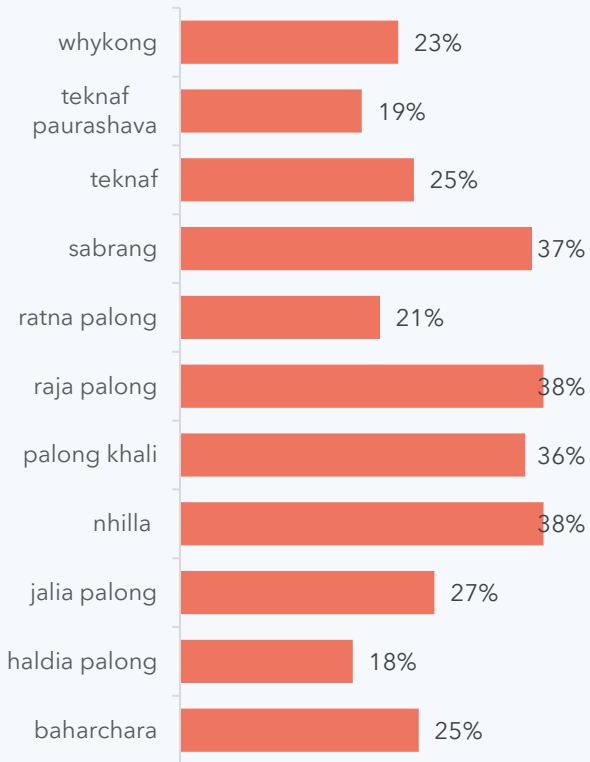

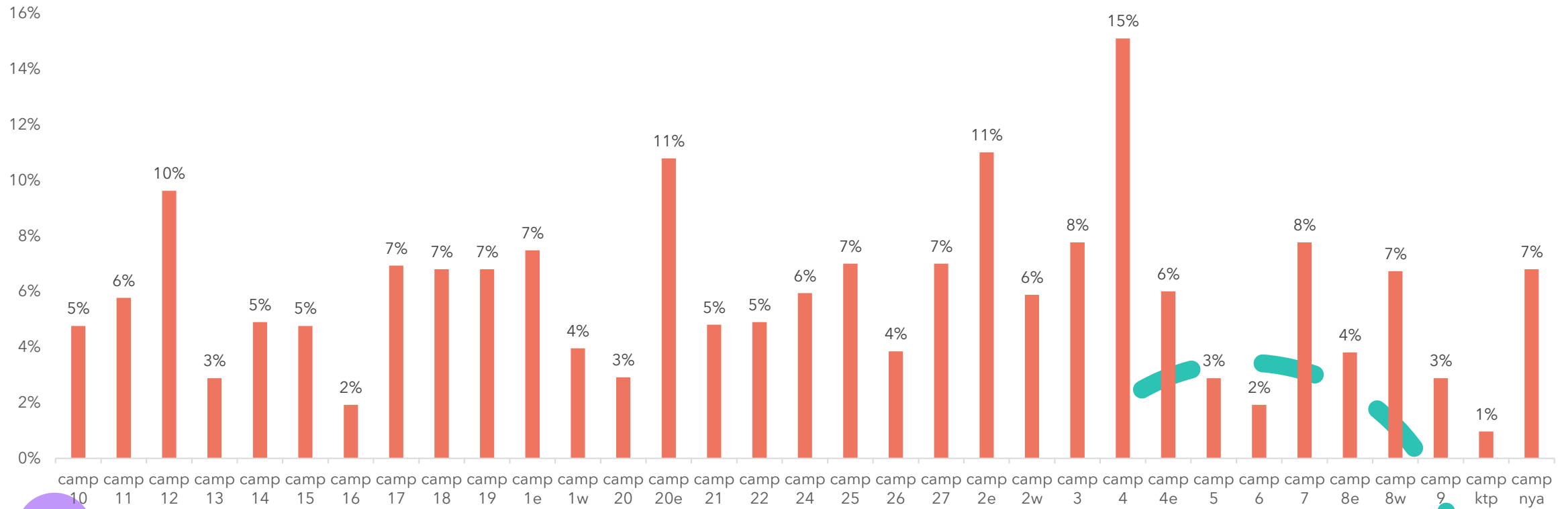

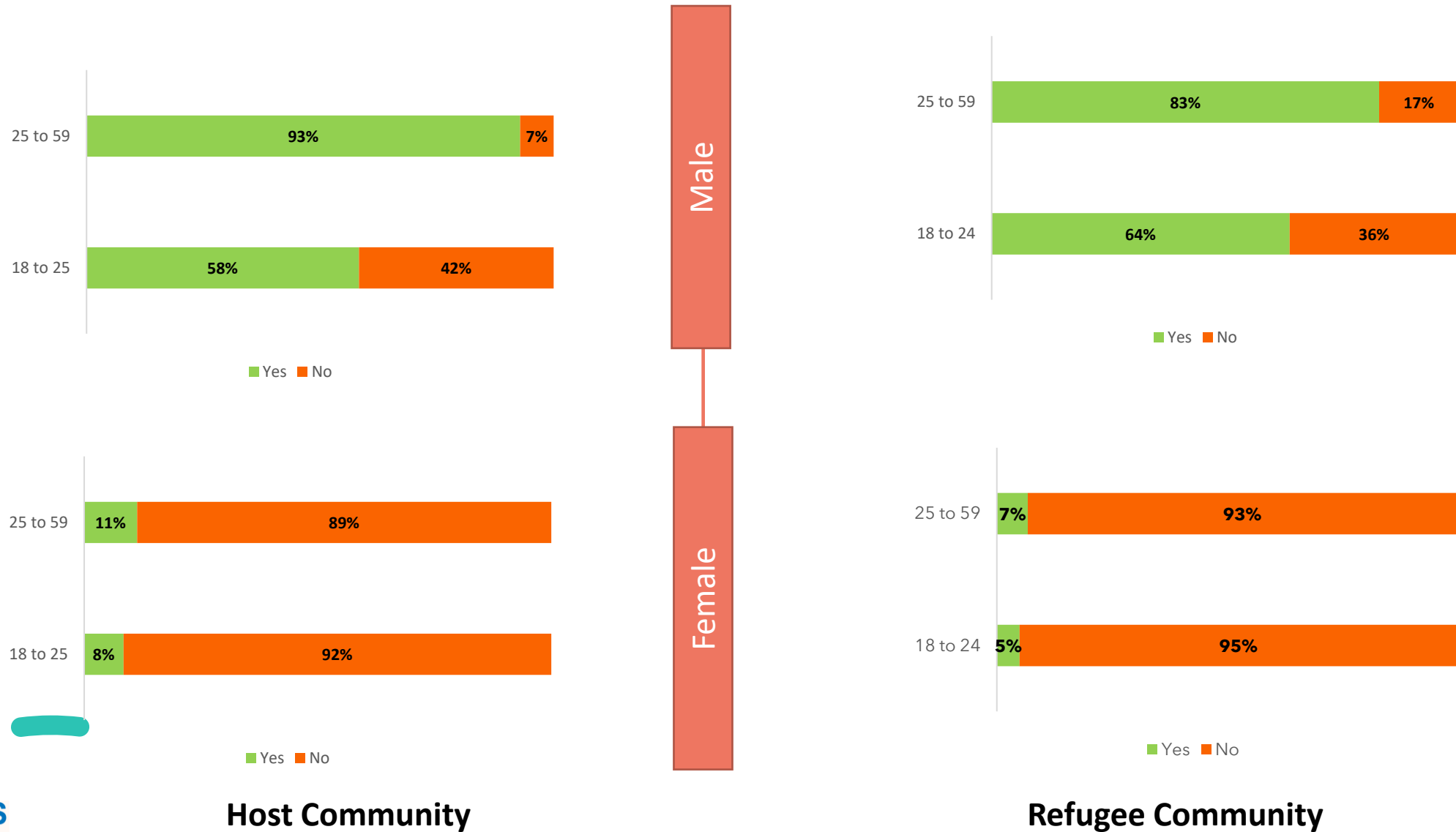


**Lack of opportunities

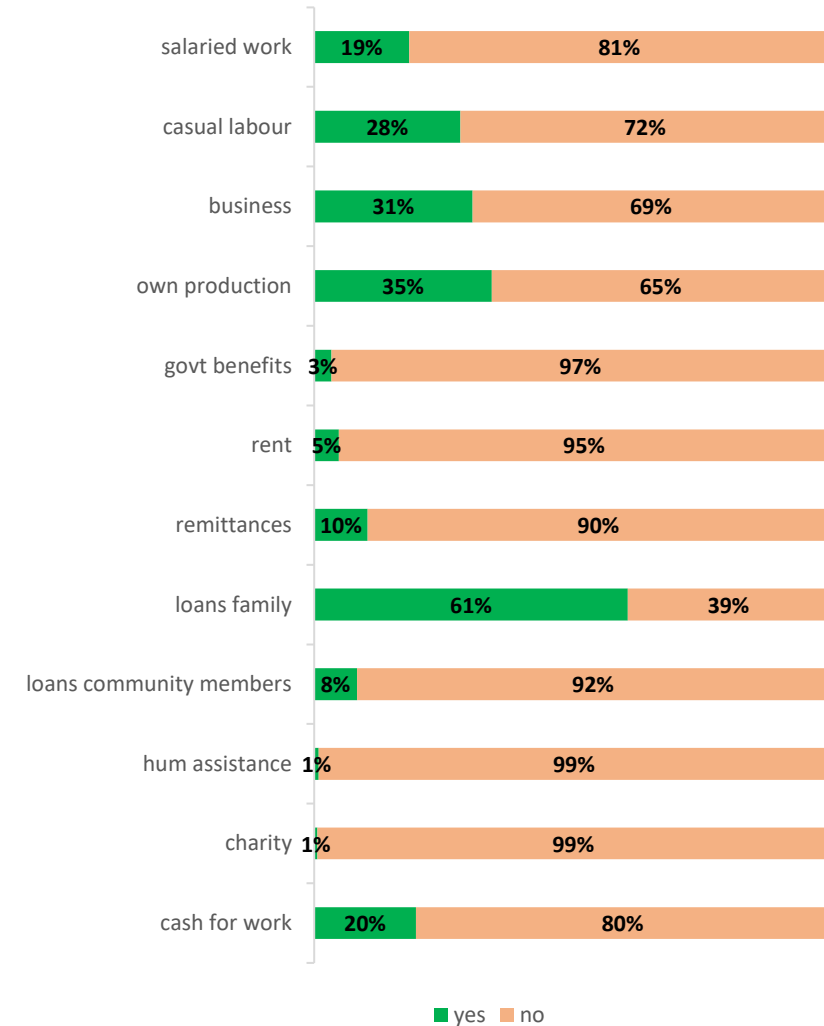


## % of persons working, out of the total population who reported working (18-59)

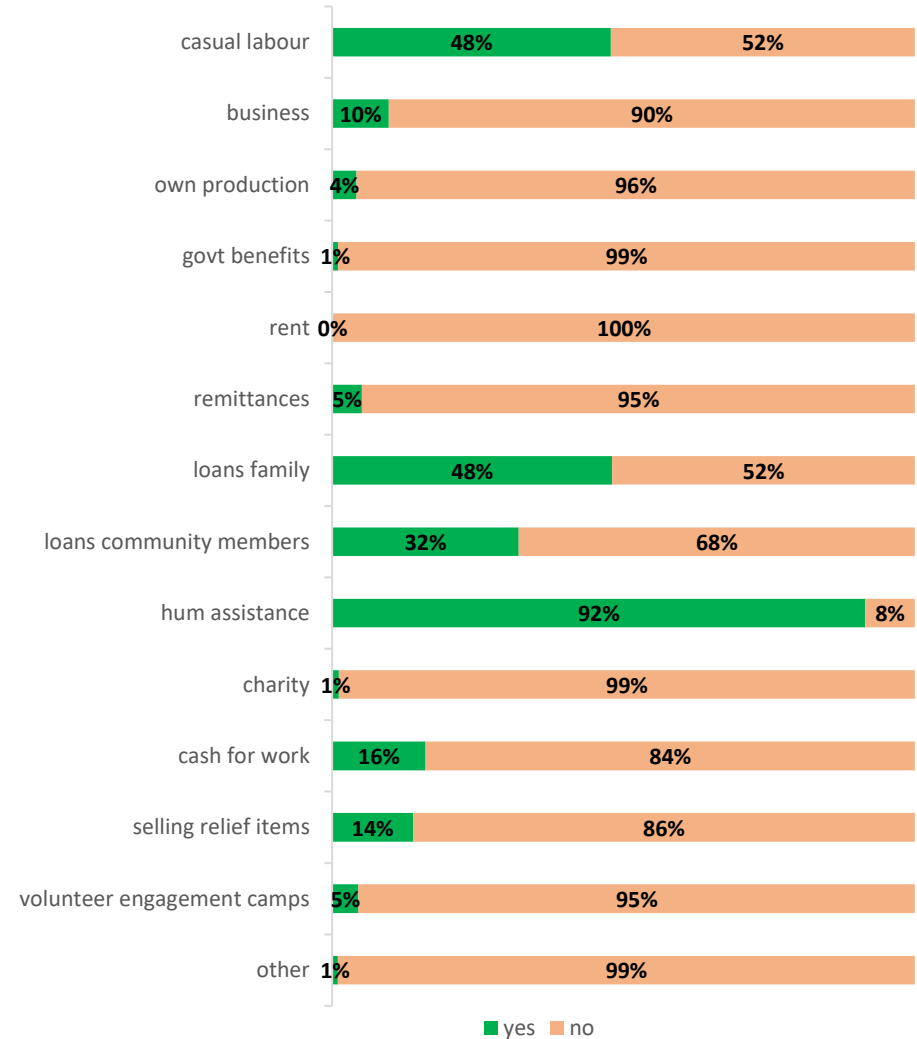
