PSEA Network Updates	<ul> <li>The PSEA Network of Cox's Bazar, IOM and WFP jointly launched the 'PSEA at the Frontline-Together We Say No' initiative on 21 November 2023 at the IOM Office (Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh). Joined by PSEA Focal Persons from 48 (I)NGOs and UN agencies, our focus was on empowering frontline staff with essential PSEA knowledge through a multilingual package, serving Rohingya refugees.</li> <li>The PSEA Network in collaboration with FCDO, INTERPOL, and Safeguarding and Resource Hub conducted a 2-day workshop in Cox's Bazar from 28 to 29 November 2023. A total of 47 Participants (26 male and 21 female) from 34 UN, INGO and BNGOs participated in the workshop. The Objective of the workshop was to contribute to safer recruitment practices and limited reoccurrence of SEA - by focusing on ways to identify known perpetrators and prevent them from being re-hired.</li> </ul>	PSEA Network

HR & PSEA Workshop	Daniel Coelho, Coordinator, SOTERIA Project, Interpol presented the initial outcome to the 'HR & PSEA workshop'. The 2-day workshop was held in Cox's Bazar on 28 & 29 November 2023. HR personnel from 48 (I)NGOs and UN agencies participated in the workshop.  Key highlights from the participants: Current situation  Siloed information on past misconducts: making it possible to re-hire offenders dismissed by fellow NM. 	<ul> <li>Limited access and use of available tools for screening and vetting.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Time pressure: need to hire quickly.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Security concerns: HR reported pressure from external counterparts.</li> </ul>	
	Key recommendations from participants:	
	<ul> <li>Guidance on existing screening mechanisms, including on how they can be accessed and used efficiently (UN Clear Check, MDS, Soteria, Criminal records, OSINT, etc.).</li> <li>Set up a local background check system (in complement to point 1, as existing mechanisms do not cover all risks) to be set as a pilot in Cox's Bazar.</li> </ul>	
	Training of HR on points 1 and 2.
