

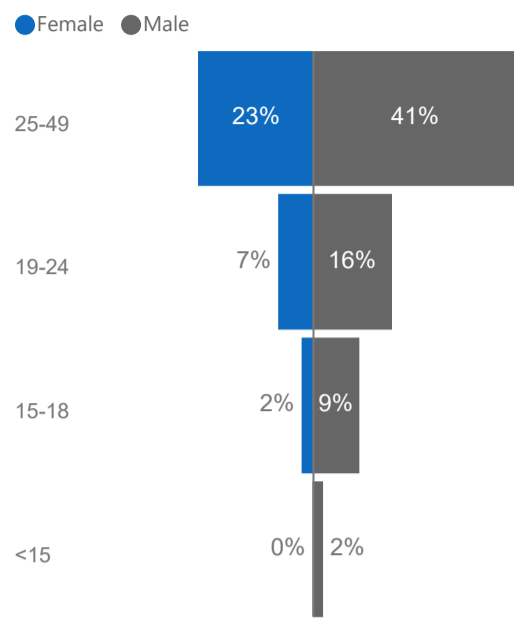

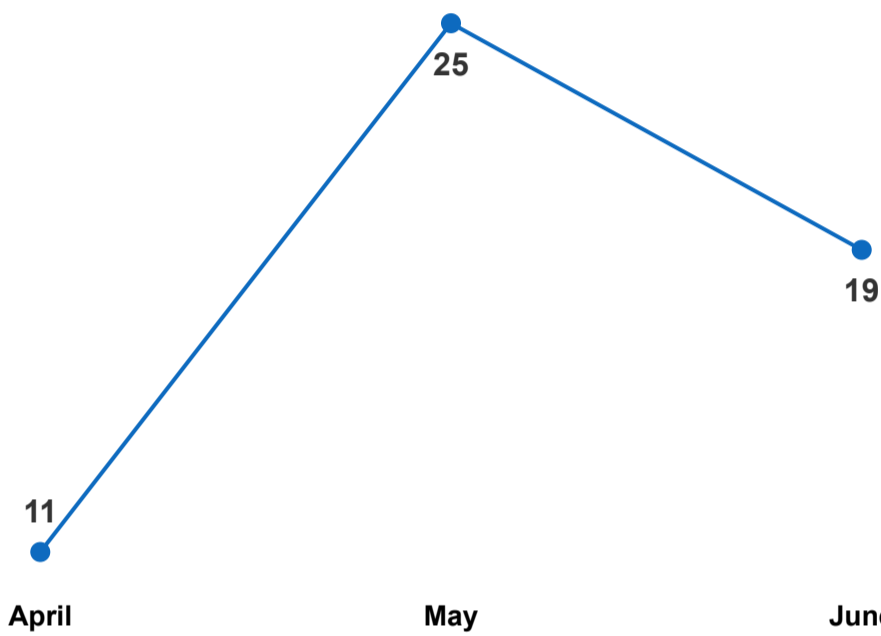

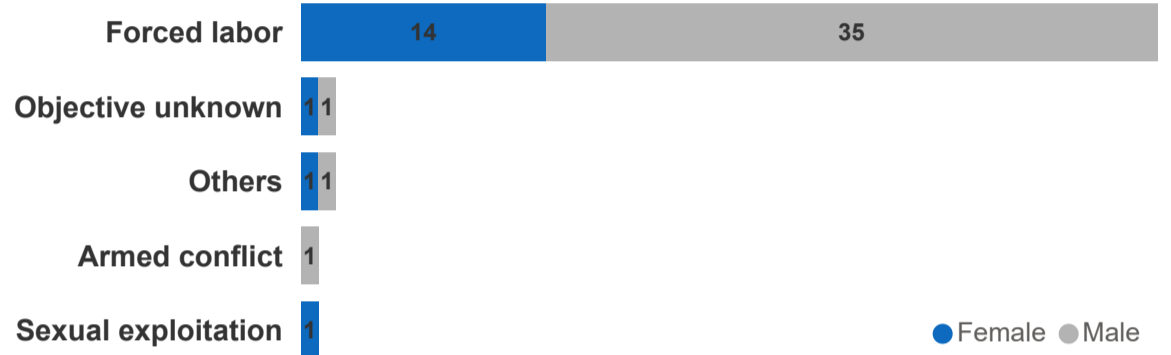
The Dashboard reflects available data about Rohingya refugees' victims of human trafficking that ATWG members have identified and assisted. **55** refugees were identified between April and June 2024. The data in this dashboard is generated only from information communicated by ATWG members and should not be interpreted as showing the extent of prevalence of human trafficking in the camps. These statistics may be subject to change.

Among the VoTs identified, **79%** of individuals identify as male and **31%** identify as female.

Number of identified victims by Month

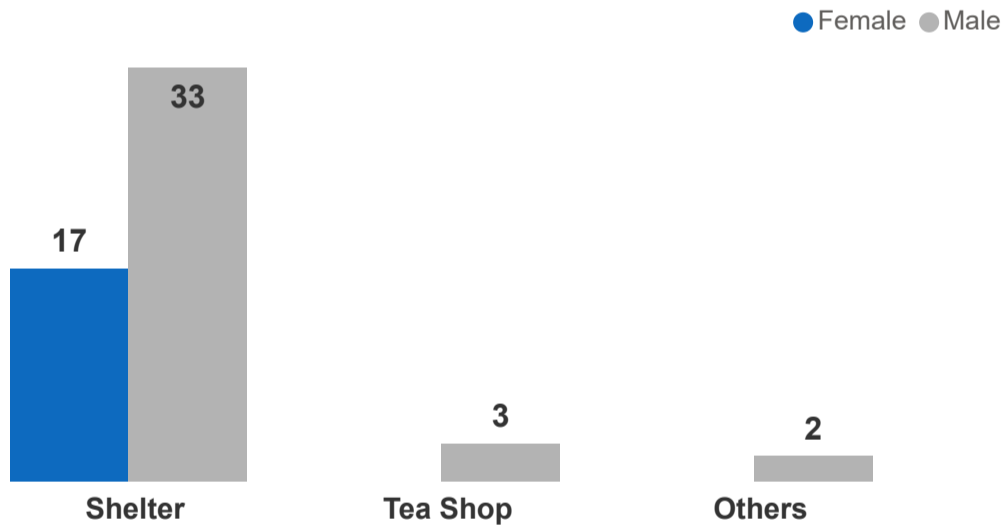


Type of Trafficking/Form of Exploitation



89% of individuals identified were victims of trafficking for the purpose of forced labor. Trafficking case for sexual exploitation and armed conflict accounted for **2%** respectively. In **two cases** categorized as "unknown", victims were taken to Malaysia and their family members were asked to pay ransom to release them, but the initial objective of the trafficking is unknown. Another **two cases** were identified in the "Other" category, including trafficking attempting to further send out of country.

Place of Recruitment by Gender



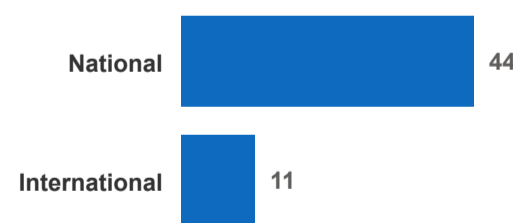
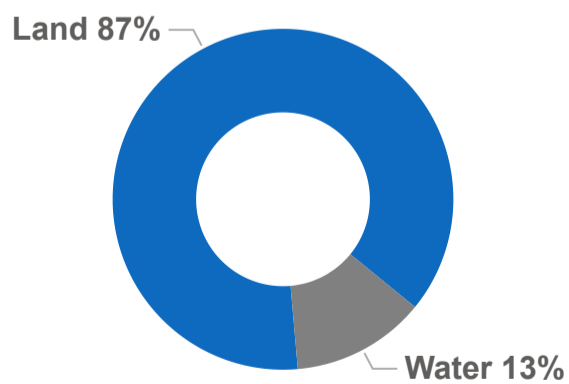
The recruitment or initial engagement into the trafficking situation mostly occurs while refugees are at their shelters (homes)

Promises During Recruitment

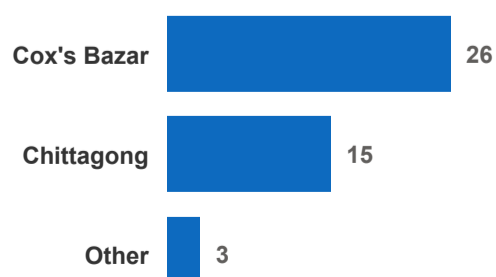


93% of reported cases, promises of work were made during the recruitment stage. In most instances, the exploitation involved activities such as agriculture, construction, domestic work, livestock raising, and day labor.

Mode of Transport and Intended Destination

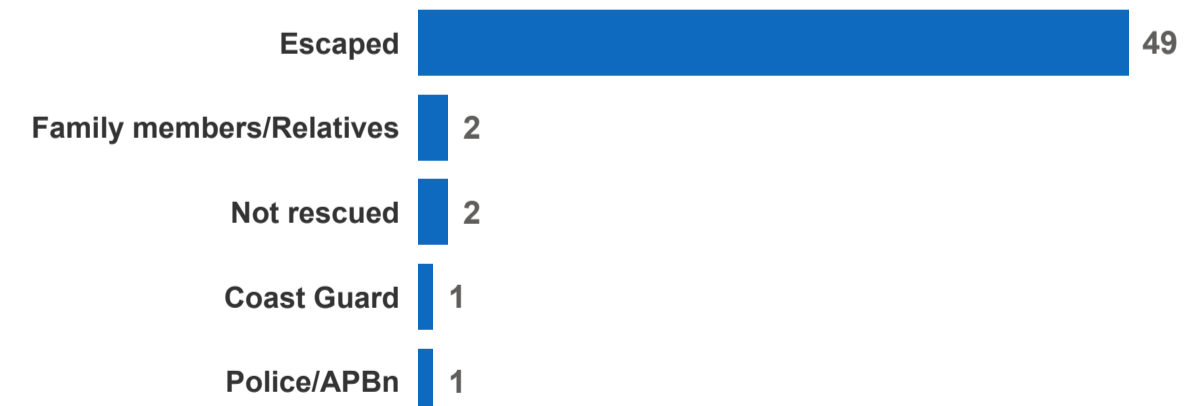


Seven cases were reportedly headed to Malaysia, while four cases were intended for Myanmar.

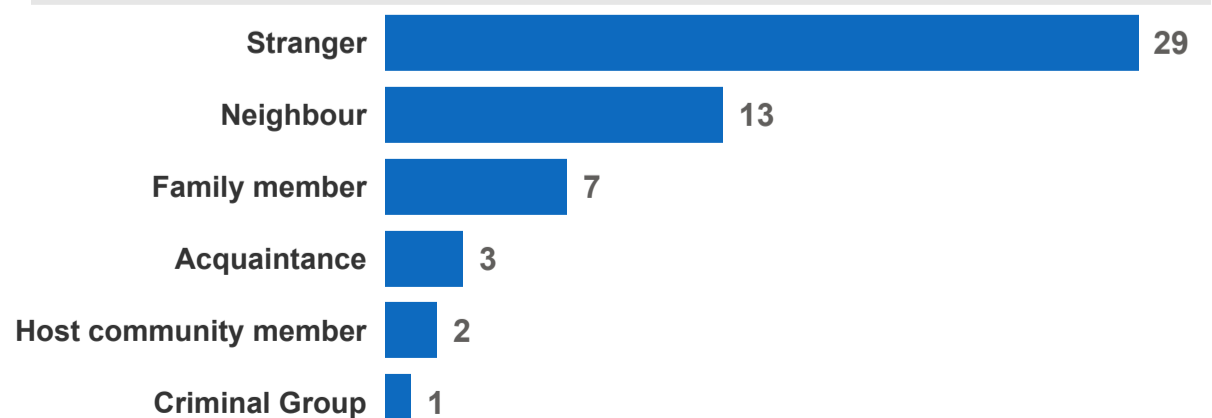


A substantial majority of trafficking victims, constituting **87%** of cases, were transported via land routes. The remaining **13%** of cases involved water transportation, such as boats or ships.

Mode of Release



Recruiter



Since January until June 2024, ATWG partners screened a total of 23 individuals (6 women, 13 men, 3 boys, and a girl) identified as Non-Victims of Trafficking (Non-VOTs) among Rohingya refugees, more than half of which were adult males. 52% of the cases were kidnapping cases, 30% were smuggling of migrants, the rest of 17% experienced internal movement within the country or were affected by other factors. It is remarkable that more than half (58%) of the identified perpetrators/brokers were those related to the victims (neighbours or acquaintances).
