<b>PSEA Network Updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Benedetta Cocco has taken on the role of PSEA Network Coordinator for Bangladesh (<a href="mailto:cocco@unfpa.org">cocco@unfpa.org</a>). She joined the Office of the United Nations Resident Coordinator in Dhaka.</li> <li>• The PSEA Network established two task teams: the Child Friendly PSEA Task Team and the PSEA CWC Task Team. They have held two meetings and are currently working on developing key PSEA messages for children.</li> </ul>	<b>PSEA Network and PSEA Network Co-Chair</b>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The PSEA Network Co-Chair, Terre des Hommes (Tdh), shared an update on a ‘Learning and Sharing workshop focused on Sexual Misconduct investigation in Bangladesh’. The workshop aimed to enhance understanding of current SEAH investigation practices, identify challenges, and bridge gaps by aligning legal frameworks with organizational practices. It took place on June 10, 2024, at the ISCG conference room.</li> </ul> <p><b>Key recommendations from the workshop include:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Forming a Technical Task Team on SEAH Investigation.</li> <li>✓ Advocating for a victim-centered investigation process.</li> <li>✓ Providing capacity-building support for network members.</li> </ul> <p>Tdh also mentioned that they are translating the IASC “Saying No to Sexual Misconduct” learning package. They plan to share the draft with the Network Members for review, and the PSEA Network will launch it in September 2024.</p>	
<p><b>Presentation on Harmonised Reporting Scheme (CHS Alliance)’</b></p>	<p>Mathilde Belli, SEAH Harmonised Reporting Scheme (HRS) lead shared a presentation on the ‘HARMONISED REPORTING SCHEME ON SEXUAL EXPLOITATION, ABUSE &amp; HARASSMENT.</p> <p>The Harmonised Reporting Scheme (HRS) aims to increase transparency and reduce under-reporting on sexual exploitation, abuse and harassment (SEAH) in the aid sector through a harmonised framework for SEAH reporting and trends analysis. The HRS collects comparable data on SEAH to support trend analyses and learning from aggregated data, which informs policies and strategies aimed at improving outcomes for victim/survivor’s and prevention interventions.</p> <p><b>WHAT IS EXPECTED FROM HRS PARTICIPANTS:</b> Report non-identifiable data on SEAH incidents using the agreed-upon template every 6 months onto the HRS online platform.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Data is aggregated with other reported data. No personal information is collected, either on the victim/survivor, the alleged perpetrator, or the organisation - all incidents are fully anonymised.</li> <li>○ The time commitment depends on the caseload and what your organisation already has in place in terms of SEAH data collection.
