She discussed the Bangladeshi laws addressing gender-based violence (GBV) and sexual harassment, highlighting their existing gaps. <p>Humanitarian Access and Service Delivery</p>	<p>The Network shared that following a telecommunications shutdown on 18 July 2024 and a nationwide curfew on 19 July, the Rohingya refugee response in Cox’s Bazar was restricted to essential activities. From 21 to 23 July, only critical missions were authorized. Normal services resumed from 24 July to 3 August after internet restoration. However, due to rising unrest, UNDSS advised limiting field missions from 4 August. The situation escalated on 4 August, leading to an indefinite curfew and national holidays. On 5 August, the Prime Minister resigned, and an interim government was announced. The curfew was lifted on 6 August, and telecommunications were restored.</p> <p>The PSEA Network shared  key PSEA messages with the Network members on 7 August to disseminate those to the volunteers, field staff and the community people.</p> <p>For any access challenges, the network members are encouraged to contact Shaikh Ashraf Ali, Humanitarian Access Coordinator, ISCG.
