

## Key Messages for GBV Prevention and Response During Monsoon/Heavy Rains (For GBV Camp Focal Points)

- Participate in Camp-based Emergency Preparedness and Response Meetings: Ensure active
  participation in the emergency preparedness and response meetings specific to your camps.
- Liaise Closely with Site Management and Sectoral Focal Points: Maintain close communication
  with the Site Management Focal Point, Camp-in-Charge, and other sectoral focal points to ensure
  coordinated action.
- **Distribute the GBV Referral Pathway**: Share the PDF version of the GBV Referral Pathway with both GBV and non-GBV actors, ensuring the pathway is tailored to each group. Use WhatsApp groups to disseminate this information efficiently.
- Assess the Functionality of Sector Service Points: In the affected areas, quickly determine
  whether sector service points are functioning and adequately staffed. Communicate any updates
  or changes in service availability.
- Maintain Continuous Liaison with PERU GBV Officers: Even if the PERU is not activated, stay in continuous contact with PERU GBV Officers to strengthen coordination and ensure safe and ethical referrals. Provide them with the updated GBV Referral Pathways to support this effort.
- Receive and Act on GBV Case Referrals: Be prepared to receive GBV case referrals from sectoral
  actors and connect survivors with the appropriate services based on their needs.
- Community Mechanism Orientation: Orient community-based volunteers (such as Safety Unit Volunteers, Community Health Workers, Fire/CPP, and Disaster Management Unit Volunteers) on the updated GBV Referral Pathway and survivor-centric response strategies during emergencies.
   This will be part of your preparedness activities.
- Stay Prepared for Emergency Safety Audits and Needs Assessments: Be ready to participate in safety audits and need assessments to identify and mitigate GBV risks in your camp areas.
