<b>PSEA Network Updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Annual Country PSEA Action Plan:</b> A workshop to develop the Annual Country PSEA Action Plan was conducted on 5 November. The draft plan has been shared with members for feedback and input.</li> <li><b>Rollout of UN Victim Assistance Protocol:</b> A two-day Training of Trainers (ToT) on the UN Victim Assistance Protocol was organized on 24–25 November in collaboration with UNRCO, UNICEF, and UNHCR. The training was facilitated by Ivana Chapcakova, PSEA Global Technical Lead at UNICEF. A total of 22 participants from UN agencies, national, and international NGOs attended. These trained participants will support the Network in facilitating further training in 2026.</li> <li><b>ToT on PSEA for Rohingya Community Volunteers:</b> ToT sessions for Rohingya community volunteers started on 23 November and will continue until 18 December, in collaboration with sectors and the RRRC office. A total of 1,370 Rohingya volunteers from all 33 camps are participating.</li> </ul>	<b>PSEA Network</b>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Community Awareness Initiative - “Together We Say No, 2.0”:</b> As part of the global initiative, IOM and WFP have been conducting community awareness activities through Forum Theatre in 10 camps, in coordination with the PSEA Network. The initiative began on 25 November and will continue until 15 December. WFP and IOM also contextualized posters for the community people.</li> <li>• <b>Translation of ‘No Excuse’ Poster:</b> NRC has translated the ‘No Excuse’ poster into Burmese. The translated version is available on the PSEA Network website.</li> </ul>	
<b>Together We Say No-2.0</b>	<p>As part of the global campaign, IOM and WFP have been conducting community awareness activities through <i>Forum Theatre</i> in 10 camps, in coordination with the PSEA Network. The initiative began on 25 November and will continue until 15 December. Additionally, WFP and IOM have contextualized posters for community dissemination.</p> <p><b>Global Campaign Objectives</b> The campaign, developed by IOM and WFP, aims to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Increase community understanding of sexual exploitation and abuse (SEA).</li> <li>• Promote the message that aid is a right, not an exchange.</li> <li>• Ensure community members know how and where to report concerns safely and confidentially.</li> <li>• Strengthen trust between communities and humanitarian actors.</li> </ul> <p><b>WFP Activities:</b></p> <p><b>Community Consultation:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 27 Focus Group Discussions (FGDs)</li> <li>• Conducted in 6 locations: Rohingya camps, Bhasan Char, Khulna, Sylhet, Rangpur, and CHT</li> <li>• 271 beneficiaries consulted (182 female, 89 male, 5 persons with disabilities)</li> </ul> <p>Production of IEC Materials:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Three types of illustrations in Bangla, English, and Burmese</li> <li>• Bangla-English for Bangladeshi communities (including CHT)</li> <li>• Burmese-English for Rohingya communities</li> </ul> <p><a href="#">Presentation on “Together We Say No   2.0”</a> was delivered by Samrawit Assefa (IOM) and Md. <b>ISNA 2025 Findings (PSEA)</b>	<p>Findings from the <b>Inter-Sector Needs Assessment (ISNA 2025)</b> related to PSEA were shared during the meeting. The final consolidated report will be disseminated once finalized and published by ISCG.</p> <p><b>Major Findings</b> <b>Existing Refugees:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>42%</b> of households reported receiving PSEA messages (an increase from <b>26% in 2024</b>).</li> </ul>	N/A

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Only <b>22%</b> received messages about <b>safe and confidential reporting</b>, while <b>78%</b> received messages that <b>aid is free</b>.</li> <li><b>62%</b> of Rohingya community members know where to report SEAH. Preferred channels include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Camp-in-Charge (CiCs)</li> <li>○ Majhi</li> <li>○ Complaint Box</li> <li>○ Women-Friendly Spaces</li> <li>○ Humanitarian Staff</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>New Arrivals:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>ISNA 2025:</b> 40% of new arrivals reported receiving <b>no PSEA messages</b>; <b>HLP 2025</b> shows an even higher <b>65%</b> with no PSEA-related messaging.</li> <li>Only <b>6.45%</b> were informed about <b>safe reporting</b>, and none were informed about <b>complaint channels</b>.</li> <li><b>25%</b> of new arrivals know where to report SEAH. Preferred channels include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ CiCs</li> <li>○ Majhi</li> <li>○ Volunteers</li> <li>○ Women-Friendly Spaces</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Based on the findings from ISNA 2025, the Network emphasized the need to increase community awareness on PSEA, particularly regarding safe and confidential reporting. Members agreed that tailored messages should be disseminated to address this gap. The Network will work on this in the upcoming months.</li> <li>✓ IOM will develop and share guidance on community engagement to support this effort.</li> </ul>	
<i><b>AoB (Any other business)</b></i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ An assessment survey for PSEA Focal Points will be conducted to review their engagement and participation in the PSEA Network, identify capacity-building needs, and determine required training. The survey link will be shared by the end of this week.</li> <li>✓ The Network will monitor members' PSEA mainstreaming activities as outlined in the JRP 2026.
